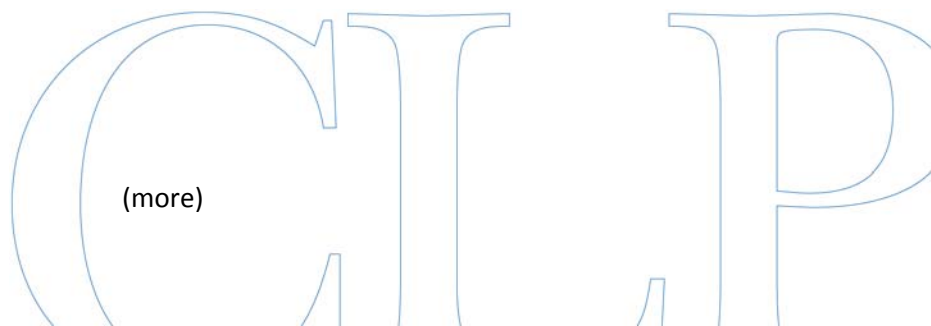
“Earning and maintaining your designation as a Certified Licensing Professional will distinguish you in the licensing industry as someone with experience and knowledge,” Wes Blakeslee, Executive Director, JHTT at Johns Hopkins University, said. “Our Office now requires that new senior licensing associates be CLP-certified or eligible to take the exam.”

Earning the CLP credential is a valuable professional and personal achievement, one that is highly valued by employers and colleagues. CLP-certified professionals demonstrate comprehension of the latest industry practices and dedication to professionalism, their careers, the industry and their clients. Employers also benefit from hiring CLP certificants and can use the credential to recognize their employees’ performance and promote qualified professionals.

CLP exam candidates must have a bachelor’s degree or higher from an accredited university, have at least three years of professional experience in the licensing field, and be currently employed in licensing at the time of the exam. The exam consists of 150 multiple-choice questions and covers eight content areas of IP licensing including:

1. Strategy
2. Opportunity assessment
3. IP protection
4. Valuation
5. Marketing

6. Agreement drafting & development
7. Negotiation
8. Agreement management

Interested candidates should review the *Candidate Handbook & Study Guideline*, available online at www.licensingcertification.org. The *Handbook* contains information about eligibility requirements, tips for preparing for the exam and practice questions and answers representing the key knowledge domains on the exam. In addition to reviewing these resources, each applicant will receive access to a 50-question online practice test.

Upon successful completion of the exam, each candidate will obtain a certificate verifying their CLP designation as well as tips on how to market their new credential and a sample press release to distribute to local media. The CLP credential is valid for three years. To maintain the credential, certificants must earn at least 40 hours of continuing education (CE) credit in a three-year period. Potential candidates must submit applications to CASTLE Worldwide, CLP, Inc.'s testing partner, at least seven days before the desired test date at any one of the 400 locations available worldwide.
